



Reading is the *most crucial academic skill* for a student to master because it is the basis for all learning. Without a strong foundation in reading, students lag in every class, year after year, because

most curriculum is taught using the skill of reading. **Unfortunately, only 47** percent of RISD students read proficiently by third grade. These students need additional interventions, resources, and YOU - champions from outside of the classroom - to catch up to their peers.

Together, lets create a literacy-rich environment that supports our at-risk students and ensures literacy success for all!

Children who do not read on level by third grade have only a 1 in 8 chance of catching up to their grade level peers.

Children who do the expected third not read on level by third grade are four times more highly correlated to incarceration likelu to drop out of school. and povertu.

What does volunteering with We Read Together look like?

Our goal is to have an extensive team of We Read Together volunteers who are wholehearted early literacy advocates! To that end:

Volunteers will receive best practices training from RISD in late February 2022. This ensures that you will feel confident and equipped to work productively with our students.

We Read Together volunteers work with our younger elementary students one-on-one or in small groups of two to four. Participating students have been identified by their teachers as needing additional reading support.

During a typical volunteer session, the student or small group is led through two literacy-focused activities by a We Read Together volunteer. All materials for the activities are provided on site.

For this pilot program of We Read Together, volunteers will serve on campuses March through May of 2022. If you wish to build a relationship with a student or small group, consider committing to volunteer at the same campus and time for the spring semester.
